

New Hampshire Association of Student Councils Awards/Recognition Programs

The New Hampshire Association of Student Councils (NHASC) sponsors several recognition awards/programs that are awarded at our annual Spring Convention which is held in May of each year in Representatives Hall at the State House in Concord, NH. Honor Council

Awarded each year to schools which meet the criteria set forth in the Honor Council application. *Activities held between April 1 of the previous year and April 1 of the current year may be included.* Applications usually take the form of a scrapbook but this is not required.

Administrator of the Year

Awarded each year to an administrator whom a member Council has considered to be most supportive and helpful in reaching their goals.

Advisor of the Year

Awarded each year to a Student Council advisor whose member Council has considered to be most supportive and helpful in reaching their goals. The recipient of this award goes on to become the New Hampshire nominee for the Warren Shull Award sponsored by the NASC.

Help Hungry Kids

Awarded each year to a member school who raises the most canned goods or cash equivalent (per student) used for donations to local food pantries or food banks. *Activities held between April 1 of the previous year and April 1 of the current year may be included.*

Ann Reardon I.O.U New Hampshire Award

Awarded each year to a member school which is selected for having the best community service program between April 1 of the previous year and April 1 of the current year. This award is named after Mrs. Ann Reardon, a former Student Council Advisor at Timberlane Regional High School and longtime member of the NHASC Executive Board who dedicated her professional life to teaching, advising and community service. Mrs. Reardon passed away at a young age and is annually remembered for her dedication to helping others.
